	The project
0	The landscape project is a national pilot project which aims to see how relevant topics of the European Landscape Convention can be implemented locally through the local planning processes.
0	We use the established planning processes and supply the planning authorities with resources to carry out landscape analyses and encourage an extra focus on landscape in the final planning documents.
0	The experiences we draw from this will hopefully be of importance for the further landscape planning strategies in Norway.
0	There is put an extra focus on participation with local inhabitants, businesses, voluntary groups, schools etc
0	The landscape project is based on a co operation between Hordaland County Council (regional policy), the Hordaland County Governor (state policy), and 4 municipalities: Lindås, Granvin, Samnanger and Sund.
	Conclusions
0	Landscape analysis is an important tool for decision makers in order to understand the 3-dimensional effects of planning and activate people's own ideas about landscape value. Hands on knowledge!
0	Project participation gives a local knowledge boost, but we need to make sure that new politicians and administrative staff 'inherit' this knowledge.
0	Landscape analysis and participation strategies need to be correctly addressed; for what and whom do we plan?
